



The show would likely benefit from some multimedia, adding slides and clips of the vocalists each performer honored. Still, even in its present form, it is likely to be well-received when it debuts at Birdland on March 8. Ultimately, Fulton certainly proved to be as fine an accompanist as she is a world-class singer-pianist.

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
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


