Suzanne Roche is the driving force behind JATB and has tirelessly dedicated herself to cultivating a vibrant jazz community and providing a platform for talented artists to shine. Her passion, vision, and relentless pursuit of excellence have propelled JATB to new heights, earning the organization a loyal following of jazz enthusiast in the Bay Area and beyond.

"Our free concerts for seniors this year reflected our belief in the transformative power of live music and honors our mission to keep swinging, classic jazz thriving.
